



PUBLIC NOTIFICATION

Martha's Table is participating in the D.C. Free Summer Meals Program.

Meals will be provided free of charge to all eligible children who attend our 2017 Summer Camp. Children who are part of households that receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) benefits are automatically eligible to receive free meals. (To be eligible to receive free meals at a residential or non-residential camp, children must meet the income guidelines listed below for reduced-price meals under the National School Lunch Program.)
